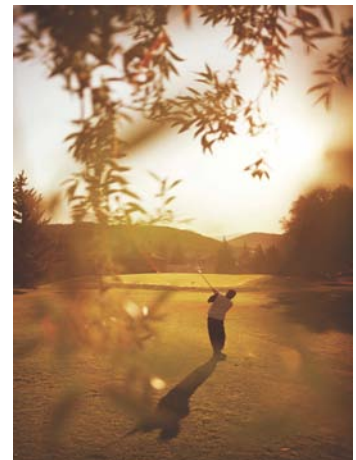

Frequently Asked Questions:

1. How should I get from the airport to Little America?

For information about all forms of transportation available out of the Salt Lake International Airport, please visit the [Rental Cars](#) and [Buses, Taxis, Limos](#) pages of the Salt Lake City International Airport website or call the airport's Ground Transportation Desk at 801-575-2477.

2. What are some of the best restaurants in town? I need to make dining reservations prior to my arrival.

Please contact our Concierge Staff at (801) 596-5799. Our concierges are aware of the finest restaurants in town for any cuisine you would be interested in. They can email or fax you with menus on various restaurants.

3. Can I get an alcoholic drink in Utah?

Here's an overview of the infamous "Utah Liquor Laws":

Beer - You can purchase 3.2% beer at grocery and convenience stores. Full-strength beer can be purchased at state liquor stores and most restaurants and clubs.

Wine - Wine can only be purchased at state liquor stores and is served in most restaurants and clubs.

Liquor - You can purchase liquor at state liquor stores and is served in most restaurants and clubs.

4. What can you tell me about your public transportation in Salt Lake City?

The Trax System (light-rail train) runs in front of our hotel. The train is free in our downtown area. You catch the train 1/2 block from our hotel lobby and continue downtown for free all day long. Trax runs from 5:30 am to 11:30 pm Monday-Saturday and 10:00 am to 10:00 pm on Sundays. You can also catch Trax up to the University of Utah at a cost of \$2.50 for a full day pass.

5. Do you have shopping malls in the area?

Yes, we have 2 shopping malls within 1 mile of our hotel. Both are easily accessible by using the Trax light-rail system. These malls are The Gateway and Trolley Square.

6. How far away are Park City and other ski areas from the hotel?

We are located 40-50 minutes from Park City and 6 other ski resorts (Alta, Brighton, The Canyons, Deer Valley, Snowbird and Solitude.)

7. Is there public transportation to the various ski resorts?

Yes, but the public transportation is only for Big & Little Cottonwood Canyons (Alta, Brighton, Snowbird & Solitude). You can take the Trax light-rail for 20 minutes south and at the train station where you get off you meet an express bus going to the resorts. The total travel time is approximately 1 hour from hotel to resort.

There are also transportation companies running buses and vans up to the various resorts. This form of ski resort transportation will run approximately \$35 for a roundtrip ride. Please contact the Concierge Desk at 801-258-6703 for more information.

8. How far is Temple Square from the hotel?

Temple Square, which is the center for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints (the Mormon religion), covers 35 acres in downtown Salt Lake City. Temple Square is located 1 mile from the hotel. You can walk or use the Trax light-rail system to get to the Square. There are tours daily from 9:00am-9:00pm every 15 minutes of the Square grounds. These tours are free.

Utah Olympic Park Exhibitions

The action takes place at the Utah Olympic Park in Park City, Utah, a short and scenic 20 minute drive from Salt Lake City. So what are winter athletes doing playing in the pool? Believe us, it's not playing. In fact, most freestyle skiers and snowboarders polish and perfect their acrobatic skills during the summer months. Utah Olympic Park

Nestled in the majestic mountains of Park City, Utah, the Utah Olympic Park is the crown jewel of the venues developed for the 2002 Olympic Winter Games. This 389 acre park hosted the bobsled, luge, skeleton, and Nordic ski jumping competitions—all to universal praise. Still a site for national and international competitions, the park serves as a training ground for athletes from around the world. But athletes aren't the only ones flocking to the park. Spectators can not only watch athletes train and prepare for future competition, they can actually taste Olympic sports themselves by stepping into jumping skis, squeezing into a bobsled, or lying down on a luge or skeleton. The Utah Olympic Park is an Olympic legacy that will long benefit any and all who experience what it has to offer.



Olympic Park Operation Hours- The Park is open to public each day from 9:00 am until 6:00 pm - no entrance fee 2nd floor Olympic Museum and it is open to the Public until 6:00 pm. The Gift Shop and Ski Museum will remain open after 6:00 pm until such time as COPAS activities at the Day Lodge are completed for the evening evening.

Tours – Two Park employees are available to ride the COPAS buses up the hill to see the bobsled starting house and the ski jump starting area.

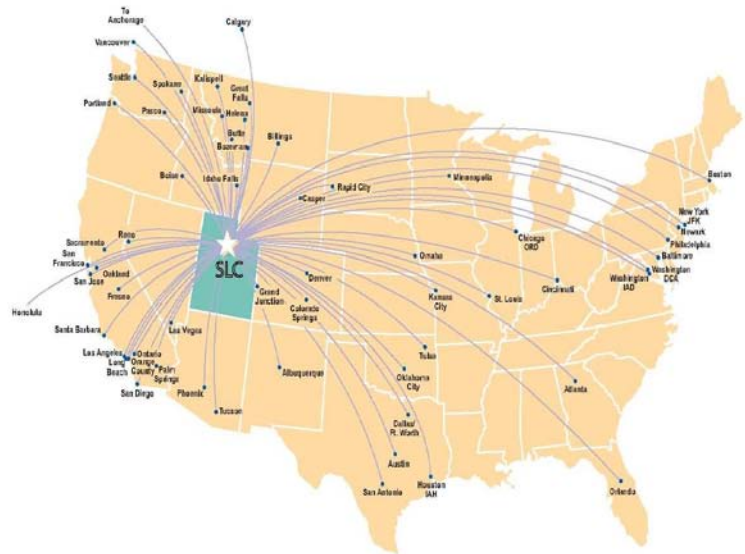

The airport is located 10 minutes from the Little America Hotel !!

- Eight airlines and their affiliates serve Salt Lake City International Airport: **American, Continental, Delta, Frontier, JetBlue, Southwest (Golf Bags Fly Free), United and US Airways.**
- Visit the web page at: www.slcairport.com for flight schedules.
- There are over 775 scheduled daily flights from the facility serving more than 100 cities with non-stop flights.
- It is a major hub for Delta Air Lines.
- The airport served 20 million passengers in 2008.
- The airport ranks 25th busiest in the United States and 59th busiest in the world in terms of passenger numbers.
- The airport is currently the first in the nation for on-time performance. There were 389,317 operations (take-offs and landings) in 2008.
- Delta Air Lines now offers non-stop service from Salt Lake City to Paris and Tokyo.
- The airport complex is made up of two terminals, five concourses and 83 gates.
- The airport offers free wireless internet access and has an interactive language translation service – "Language Line".
- It is within 40 minutes to an hour of seven major ski resorts.
- There is convenient access from the airport to five national and 42 state parks.
- Gateway to 100 golf courses statewide, 24 in Salt Lake County and 25 more within an hour's drive.



Transportation

– Rental Car Information

Car rental facilities are located on the ground floor of the short-term parking garage directly across from the terminal buildings: Advantage, Alamo, Avis, Budget, Dollar, Enterprise Rent-A-Car, Fox Rent A Car, hertz, National and Thrifty.

Utah Transit Authority. A UTA bus leaves the airport for the city center every 30 minutes during the day and every 60 minutes after 7:00 pm. One way fare is \$2.00.
